## PATTERN: HOUNDSTOOTH

A classic British tweed pattern that is one of Roger's favorite memories from childhood.

"I remember it being worn by both my mother and father, as well as both grandparents. This version is as I remember it, big in scale-like to a child's eyes."







## PATTERN: XOXO

This pattern was inspired by Roger's love of simple and classic patterns.

“There is a reason for their enduring allure. XOXO is simply a combination of two of them, a diagonal lattice with a polka dot, but with a shaded detail to add trompe l'oeil dimension.”







## PATTERN: MALACCA

Malacca is the name of storied Indonesian destination which became synonymous with the fashionable silver handled walking stick carried by men in the 18th Century to replace their swords.

The cane from which these sticks were made was valued for its lightness, strength and rarity having traveled many thousands of miles by sea to become an essential part of a gentleman's wardrobe.

"Malacca is a large scale classic caning pattern historically used for lightweight seating platforms and my favorite design created from this material".







## PATTERN: SEEING SPOTS

Roger has loved big polka dots since his first encounter with Minnie Mouse and Daisy Duck.

“I wanted to bring a new dimension of luster and interest to this classic, delightful pattern by adding a checkerboard.”







## PATTERN: ZIG ZAG BAROQUE

“A herringbone pattern made very bold becomes a zigzag, like those found in renaissance architectural details.

Textural romance is added in the imaginary floral pattern seen through the zigzag window.”



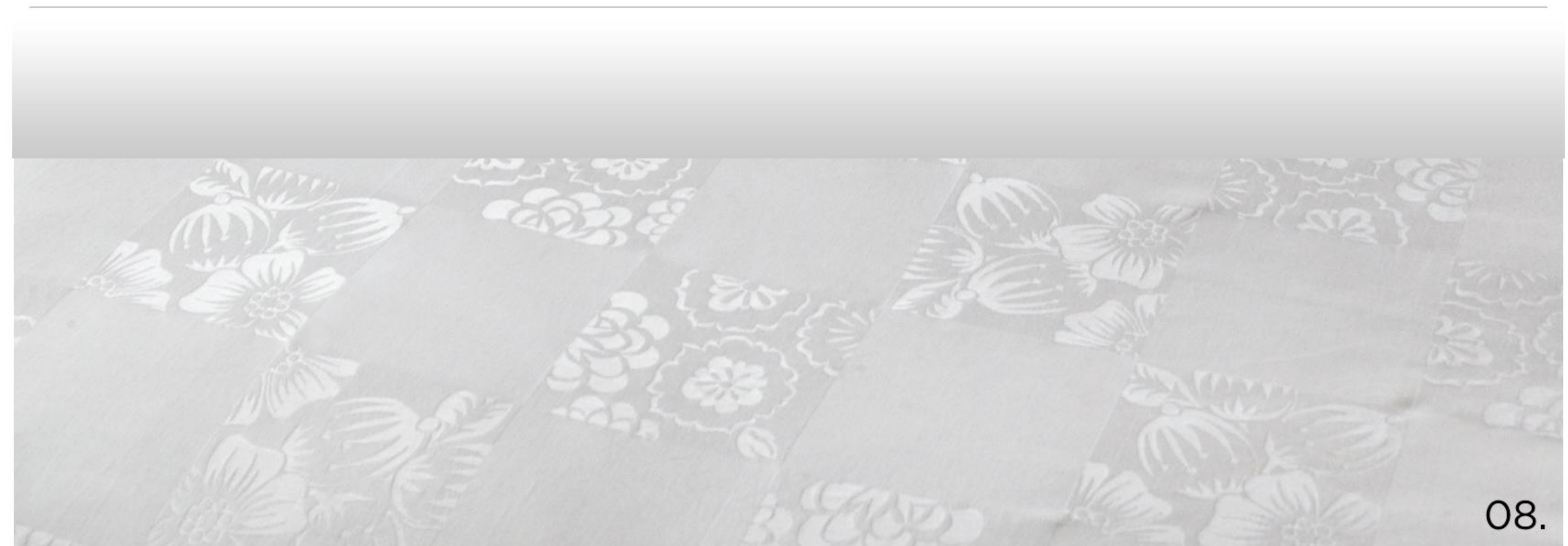




## PATTERN: CHECQUERS
